MARCH 1 AT NOON: CSU EMPLOYEES RALLY FOR A FAIR CONTRACT AT CSU EAST BAY

What: This Wednesday at noon, CSU staff members across the CSU East Bay campus will rally in support of the CSU Employees Union bargaining team as the union and management conduct negotiations for a new statewide contract.

Background: The CSU Employees Union, or CSUEU, represents more than 16,000 classified staff employees across the 23 CSU campuses and the Office of the Chancellor. A three-year contract covering nearly all of those workers expires on June 30. The union and management have their second round of negotiations for a new contract this Tuesday through Thursday at CSUEB.

Issues to be negotiated: parking fees, movement through salary ranges, promotion opportunities, retirement contributions, retirement medical plans, and related benefits—all of which are hot-button issues for CSUEU's members. At Wednesday's rally, employees will show their support of their bargaining team as it works to negotiate a fair contract for all.
