601.00 ELECTIONS

* * *

601.03 Terms of Office

- (a) The term of office of all Board of Directors, Bargaining Unit Council, Chapter Officers, Chapter Bargaining Unit Representatives (CBUR) and General Council Delegates/Alternates shall be for three (3) years, in accordance with CSEA General Council. Such terms shall commence upon announcement of the election results, with the exception of General Council Delegates/Alternates-Elect, who are sworn in at General Council. (BD 36/08/4) (BD 42/09/3) (BD 3/10/1)
- (b) The term of office of Bargaining Unit Council members shall be for three (3) years or shall end when the BUC member: (1) is no longer a member of that Bargaining Unit; or (2) is recalled as a Chapter BUR; or (3) resigns as a Chapter BUR. However, Bargaining Unit Chairs and Vice Chairs who are not re-elected as chapter Bargaining Unit Reps may serve the remainder of their term(s).

The 2009-2010 term of all current officers shall be extended by one year. (BD 3/10/1)
