#### **Dawn McCulley**

Greetings! My name is Dawn McCulley and I am asking for your vote for Delegate to the SEIU Convention. I am a 28-year employee of the CSU and have been a CSUEU union activist for approximately 20 years. Over the years I developed a strong understanding of members' needs and I want to serve your interests at the SEIU Convention.

At my Stanislaus chapter, I led programs with the other chapter leadership and stewards to develop performance evaluation workshops, IRP workshops, and benefits presentations to strengthen the knowledge and advocacy of our members. As Chief Steward and Chapter President (at the same time), I worked on our chapter's "Did You Know?" series of member education articles about our collective bargaining rights, in formats that could be easily ingested and applied. These efforts have contributed to our chapter consistently having a high membership percentage (near or at 80%) and a large active group of stewards.

I have served CSUEU members at the statewide level on the Classification Committee, Policy File Committee and the Bargaining Unit 7 Council as an at-large Council Member, Vice-chair and current Chair. While attending a Unit 7 Council, I shared the idea of performing an analysis of employees' salary placement in their salary ranges compared to their years of service. Our Chapter Communications Officer used the PIMS payroll data to graph each classification, salary, and years of service to show that the CSU does not assign salary with any consistency. I presented the results to our Classification Committee and Senior Labor Relations Representative, our Union's chief negotiator.

As Vice Chair for BUC 7, I was also part of the Bargaining Team who negotiated a number of system and campus policies during COVID. As Chair for BUC 7, I was also part of the Bargaining Team that negotiated the 7% GSI increase in 2022/2023 and 5% GSIs we achieved for 23/24 and 24/25 as well as salary steps. Membership was a big part of this last win and your support was invaluable. As Chair, I have made sure to invite all Unit 7 members, provide monthly updates on issues impacting Unit 7 staff, bargaining and other negotiation updates, and fielding questions during the zoom and via email for those who cannot make the meetings.

As a member of the CSUEU Board of Directors, I work diligently to fulfill my fiduciary responsibility to scrutinize our Union budget, spending, and governing policies. I strongly believe it is important that members have visibility into how their Union dues are spent so they can have confidence in the Union leadership.

Please support me as I continue to advocate for you and cast a vote for me. Voting will be held at each campus March 14 (12:00 pm - 6:00 pm) and March 15 (9:00 am - 12:00 pm).
