APRIL 6 AT NOON: CSU EMPLOYEES RALLY FOR A FAIR CONTRACT AT SAN JOSE STATE UNIVERSITY

What: This Thursday at noon, CSU staff members across the San Jose State University campus will rally in support of the CSU Employees Union bargaining team as the union and management conduct negotiations for a new statewide contract.

Background: The CSU Employees Union, or CSUEU, represents some 16,000 classified staff employees across the 23 CSU campuses and the Office of the Chancellor. A three-year contract covering nearly all of those workers expires on June 30. The union and management are conducting negotiations for a new contract April 5 through 7 at San Jose State.

Issues to be negotiated: movement through salary ranges, promotion opportunities, parking fees, retirement contributions, retirement medical plans, and related benefits—all of which are hot-button issues for CSUEU's members. At Thursday's rally, employees will show their support of their bargaining team as it works to negotiate a fair contract for all.
